Dear Mayor Stankiewicz,

Boys and Girls Clubs of West Georgia has enjoyed a strong relationship with the City of Hogansville and its citizens. We provide after school care and an eight week summer camp for youth from grade 1 through 5. As a result of the advocacy of yourself and Police Chief of Hogansville, we were able to open the in school club at Callaway Middle School serving grades 6 through 8.

Currently we are serving 164 youth at the Hogansville Club with an average daily attendance of 110. At Callaway Middle, we are serving 62 with an average daily attendance of 22. The continued funding of the City of Hogansville is critical to maintaining this service. The majority of our club members are youth who are receiving free and reduced lunch and their parents depend on our clubs for quality after school care. Please find attached an outline of our programming and goals along with the 2017 budget and how funds are expended in Hogansville and the Callaway Middle Unit.

On behalf of our Board of Directors, our staff and the youth we serve, we are respectfully requesting the same total funding of \$15,000 for the 2018-2019 fiscal year budget. Our Mission: To enable young people, especially those who need us most, to reach their full potential as productive, caring, responsible adults.

Boys and Girls Clubs fill the gap between school and home. We provide welcoming, positive environments in which kids and teens have fun, participate in life-changing programs, and build supportive relationships with peers and caring adults. After school programs and services in Troup County are offered at 3 locations. Eight week summer camps are offered in LaGrange and Hogansville. (Budget figures represent Hogansville and Callaway separate from the LaGrange unit.)

All programming is based upon guidelines established through evidenced based research by the Boys and Girls Clubs of America. Data is collected by all staff so each child and each program is evaluated for effectiveness. All of the programming is augmented by field trips when possible as well as assigned mentors. College students have been our greatest asset for building positive relationships with the kids.

Boys and Girls Clubs Goals focus on:

- Academic Success measured by:
 - √ 85% of our youth will improve proficiency in math, reading and science
 - √ 90% of our youth will graduate from high school on time who has attended Boys and Girls Club on an average of 3 times a week. (156 visits a year)
 - √ 70% of our seniors who go on to college will complete at least 2 years
 of college or post-secondary education/training.
- Good Character and Citizenship measured by:
 - √ 90% of our youth will report positive social competence, empowerment and self-concept through coordinated mentor enrichment program.
 - √ 60% of our middle school and 75% of our high school youth will be actively involved in civic engagement inside and outside the Boys & Girls Club.
- Healthy Lifestyles measured by:
 - √ 80% of our youth will exercise 60 minutes/day, 5 days per week.
 - √ 90% of our youth will demonstrate improvement in healthy habits.
 - √ 90% of our youth will abstain from using drug and alcohol.
